

DECLARATION

FOR A RE-RATING OF AN INVALID PENSION.

BEFORE NOTICE.—If this declaration is executed before a Justice of the Peace or a Notary Public, the certificate of the Clerk of the Court, as to the official character and genuineness of the signature of such officer must be attached. Neglect to comply with this requirement will cause trouble and DELAY.
