, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says:

I am the identical Peter Mitchell who served as 1st Sergt. Co. H. 9th U.S. Ct. and now a pensioner under the act of June 27, 1890 c. 12. for deafness of both ears, contracted in service at Deep Bottom Va. and caused by concussion of head remaining while supporting heavy artillery at the battle of Deep Bottom. I also contracted disease of eyes in service between India and claim pension for them.

Q Did you ever apply for pension under the old law?

A. No sir, I never applied for pension until after the new law had passed. This was I came to apply in the first place was this: after I heard that the new law had passed and believed that I was entitled to pension I went to the office of A. Percival Lloyd and made my claim. I know that Geo. De Villiers of my Company went to Lloyd's office with me two or three times but I don't remember whether he was with me there the first time or not.
