Sir:

In the above-entitled claim, you are advised that there should be furnished the evidence indicated in the accompanying circular letter.

There is also required a certified copy of the public record, or, if there is no such record, the sworn statement of credible witnesses having knowledge of the facts, showing the date of death of the soldier's former wife, Frederica E.

In a paper filed in December 1900 the soldier stated that his wife's name at the time of his marriage to her was Annie M. Dailey, and her maiden name was Annie M. Satchell (or Gatchell), thus indicating a prior marriage of the claimant, and in the certified copy of the public record of claimant's marriage to the soldier, her name and social condition are given as "Annie M. Dailey, widow."

The claimant should furnish her statement showing the full and correct name of her former husband and explaining why she alleged in her declaration, filed August 6, 1921, that she had not been married prior to her marriage to the soldier.

Name and service of soldier and number of claim should be inscribed upon all papers filed.
