Case of Annie M. Heath

On this 3 day of February , 1922, at Baltimore county of Baltimore City , State of Maryland before me, W. H. Stovall , a Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared Annie May Heath , who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 61 years old, occupation housekeeper, and post
2 office address 1233 Druid Hill ave, Baltimore Md.
3 I claim pension as the widow of Jacob Heath who served
4 in the army and was a pensioner and died in Baltimore
5 in the month of July 1921 of heart trouble and dropsy,
6 and I have not remarried since his death.
7 I was married to Jacob Heath in Baltimore on June 6, 1900
8 and lived with him as his wife until his death and we
9 were never separated or divorced. I had one child by
10 Jacob Heath, a son, Arnett Heath, now 20 years old, and
11 still living. I was married to Jacob Heath with the
12 usual license and by Rev John Collett of the M E Church.
13 I was born in Accomac county Va and came to Baltimore at
14 the age of 12 years and resided here continuously since.
15 My parents were Emma and Christopher Satchell, both dead,
16 and I have one living brother, Frederick Palmer of Dough-
17 erty, Accomac Co, Virginia, and no sisters.
18 Jacob Heath was born on Kent Island in Kent Co Md and I
19 do not know the date he located in Baltimore or whether
20 he lived here prior to going into the army. He has
21 lived in Baltimore a good many years. I knew him thirty
22 odd years ago through attendance at the same church - the
23 Ebenezer M E Church in Montgomery st near Charles street.
24 I am unable to give the names of the parents of my late
25 husband Jacob Heath and he has no living brothers and
26 sisters. Jacob Heath was known by no other name, and
27 he had no middle name to my knowledge. He was a shoe
