- Q. How many times has Annie Heath been married?
- A. Only one time and that was to Jacob Heath with whom she lived in the relation of a wife until his death.

 And she has not married again since the death of Heath as I live within one block of her house and see her often.
 - Q. What name was Annie known to you by in your childhood?
- A. Annie Satchell. She came from Virginia and was a right young girl at date of locating in Baltimore is what I have understood. I knew none of her family.
- Q. Has Annie borne any other name since you became acquainted with her? A. Yes she was known for a time by the name of Annie Daily and it was due to her living with a man in south Baltimore named Charles Daily, he was a laborer, have seen him but had little acquaintance with him, and it strikes me that Annie had one child by him that did not live.
