I do not know where Annie Dailey got the name of Dailey and 'I have never known her parents or other members of her family. I have never known one Charles R. Dailey in this connection. I have no information concerning any marriage of this woman to one Charles R. Dailey of Baltimore. Annie was living alone in Dover street in Baltimore and renting out rooms when I first knew her. No man was living with her and Jacob Heath is the first consort she has had to my knowledge. Annie Heath has always claimed that she was not married prior to her marriage to Jacob Heath and I have believed what she said. I saw her married to Jacob Heath.
