1 I am 66 years old, occupation janitor, retired, and
 2 post office address 1307 Division st, Baltimore Md.
 3 I have lived in Baltimore since 1863 and was a resident
 4 of Kent Island in Queen Annes Co Md prior to that.
 5 I knew Jacob Heath on Kent Island when I was a little
 6 boy and I recollect when he came home from the army as
 7 his family lived about a quareter of a mile from me at
 8 the time, he was a free man and so was I, he lived on
 9 old man Exums place, and Heath came to this city after I
 10 came, guess I was here when he got home from the army.
 11 In this city Jacob Heath was a shoemaker and was my
 12 brother in law, we were never close neighbors, he used
 13 to live in Warner street and I in Sharp Street. I was
 14 to ill to attend his funeral, have been confined to
 15 my house over one year with the rheumatism.

16 Q. How many times was Jacob Heath married?

17 A. Three times. His first wife was my sister Frederica
 18 and his second wife was another sister of mine, her name
 19 was Harriet Jane Brown, and the woman he left at his death
 20 was Heaths third and last wife. Jacob Heath had no wife on
 21 Kent Island no sir, he had no wife before he went to the
 22 war sir. I think he married Frederica on Kent Island. She
 23 died before his marriage to Harriet Jane and Jane was
 24 dead when he married the wife who is still living. I for-
 25 get her name and I might have known her prior to her
 26 marriage to Heath but wont swear it now. I do not know
 27 whether she was previously married. Her name is Annie Heath.
