On this 4 day of February, 1922, at Baltimore county of Baltimore City, State of Maryland before me, W. H. Stovall, a Special Examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared Mary A. Tibbs, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

1 I am 59 years old, occupation cook, and post office
2 address 408 Dolphin st, Baltimore Md. Am not married.

3 I have lived in this city my entire life and have known
4 Annie M. Heath at least fifty years and our acquaintance
5 began by living in her block and she then worked out in
6 service and I was no more than a child. I do not know
7 where she was born and reared. I knew her by the name
8 of Annie Satchell at first and then by the name of Annie
9 Heath and have been a close associate of Annie for fully
10 fifty years it seems to me though we are not related.

11 She used to make her home with my mother Mary E. Tibbs in
12 Ensor street when she did not have a job in service.

13 Q. Who was her first husband?

14 A. Charles Daily. I knew him well and he was married
15 to Annie Satchell I suppose as they lived together as man
16 and wife for some years. Do not know of any children born
17 to Daily and Annie. They separated for some cause and I
18 did not learn the cause of their troubles. I do not know
19 whether they were divorced. I have not seen Mr Daily for
20 twenty years or more. I knew Mr Heath better than I did Daily.

21 Q. Who was the next husband of Annie Satchell?

22 A. Jacob Heath. I knew him very well from about the date
23 of their marriage. They never separated and were not divorced.
24 I used to go to their house nearly forty times in the month.
25 I live at present just around the corner from Annie Heath
26 and know that she has not married again since the death of
27 Jacob Heath and she has made her home since he died in the
