property he left to her at his death. I did not know any former wife that Heath may have had. He was a good shoe maker. I was not a witness to the marriage of Charles Daily to Annie Satchell and recall nothing concerning their marriage that I may have heard at the time though I was often at their house. I do not know in fact that she married Daily lawfully though I would suppse so as she has always been such a nine woman. I have known of but one child that Annie has given birth to and that is the son by Jacob Heath - his name is Arnett Heath. I have no financial interest in this claim for pension. I did not know Charles Daily prior to the time he began living with Annie Daily as her husband. They lived together as man and wife and were so considered but I am wholly unable at this time to recall the length of thier married life. I was sworn to the affidavit that I signed in this claim and yet I do not recall what the affidavit was to cover and just answered the questions that the clerk asked me. If the affidavit does not mention that Annie was the wife of Charles Daily it is not my fault as I answered the questions of the notary who did the writing. I knew this woman by the name of Annie Satchell at first and then by the name of Annie Daily and next as Annie Heath and she has borne no other name nor lived with any other man in the marital relation to my knowledge. My acquaintance with Annie Heath has not been continuous and for a number of years we lost track of each other, I used to travel with families as a numse and was in Philadelphia and other places, and it was for fifteen or eighteen years that Annie and I did not see much of each other. She has lived in Baltimore all the time I would suppose though I cannot swear that she has. I have heard the foregoing deposition read and it is correct. It was prior to the marriage of Annie Satchell to Jacob Heath that I was absent from Baltimore as a murse.
