I heard after the death of Jacob Heath that he was married five times and this information was obtained from the talk of some of the men at Bethel church after his death. I do not know who would be in a position to set you straight in this matter. If I informed you in September 1921 that Jacob Heath was married five times the information came in the way I have just stated and I am entirely without personal knowledge of the marriages of Heath.

Q. I am informed that Jacob Heath was married only four times? A. I do not know myself. I have no financial interest in this claim and am not related to this soldier or any of his wives and am not acquainted with any of his wives.
