DECLARATION FOR WIDOW'S PENSION.

Act of May 1, 1920.

STATE OF Maryland, COUNTY OF Baltimore, ss:
On this 3rd day of August, 1921, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace
within and for the County and State aforesaid, Annie M. Heath, who, being duly
sworn by me according to law, declares that she is 60 years of age and that she was born January 15th, 1861
at Accomac Co., Virginia
That she is the widow of Jacob Heath, who enlisted December 20th, 1863
at Unknown, under the name of Jacob A. Heath,
as a Sergeant Co. C. 18th Colored Vol. Inf. Regt.
(Rank.)

and was honorably discharged January 15th, 1867, having served ninety days or more, or was discharged for
or died in service of a disability incurred in the service and in the line of duty, during the CIVIL WAR.
