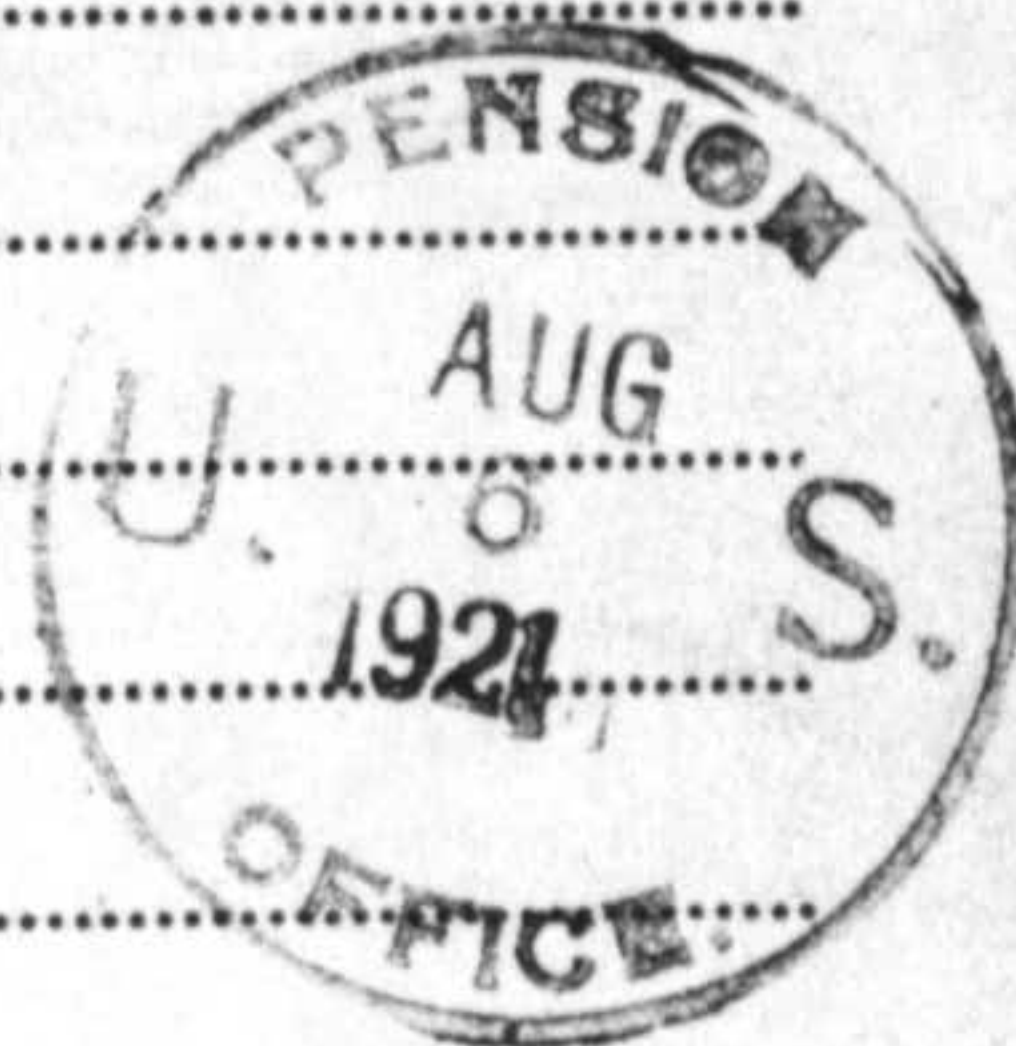
ON THIS 4th day of August, A. D. 1921, personally appeared before me
