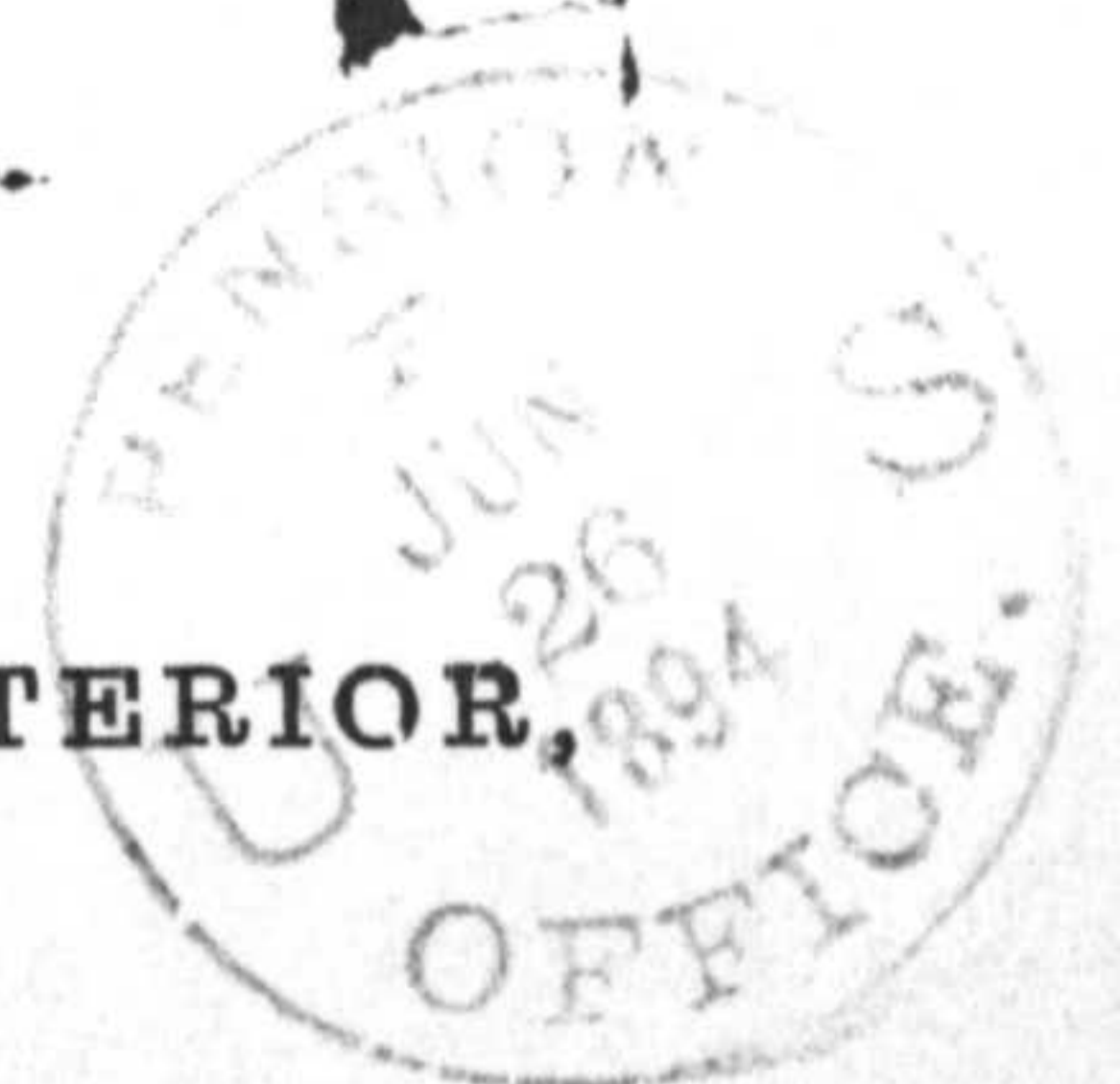

When did you first see claimant after he returned from the army, and how do you fix the date?

Answer: *We were both discharged at the same time and place July 15 1867 and remember the date from that fact*

Of what disability did he complain, and how was he affected?

Answer: *Complained of Rheumatism in his knees and back and appeared to be suffering in those parts of his body he also complained of dizziness*

How frequently have you seen him since your first acquaintance?

Answer: *He served with me in the same regiment until our discharge in Washington Md 1879 since that time he has been under my observation*

If he has continued to suffer with such disability, please describe the symptoms which were apparent to you, and state to what extent he has been disabled for manual labor thereby during each year?

Answer: *Since 1879 he has complained of the same disabilities up to the present time, and he would point out the places on his back and knee which hurt him and appeared to be suffering pain there I cannot say how much time in any year he has lost*
