

Declaration for Invalid Pension.

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Under the Acts of June 27th, 1890, and May 9, 1900, and Commissioner of Pensions' Order No. 78, of March 15, 1904, on Account of Old Age.

To be executed before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. The official character and signature of any such officer not required by law to use a seal must be certified by the clerk of the proper court, giving dates of beginning and close of official term. If certificate on file, so state.

Here state rank, company

19th and regiment if in the army, or vessel if in the navy

in the service of the United States in the War of the Rebellion, and served at least Ninety Days,

and was HONORABLY DISCHARGED at 1861, on the 30th day of April

1861. That he is Wholly unable to earn a support by manual

labor by reason of Disabilities resulting from alleged rage

Here name the diseases or injuries from which disabled.

Claims under Order 78

and also by reason of infirmities of age.

He was born on the 16 day of April, 1830, and his present age is 75 years.

That said disabilities are not due to vicious habits, and are, to the best of his knowledge and belief, of a permanent character.

That he has not applied for pension under application No. 640164 That he is a pensioner

under Certificate No. 540164 as per evidence disabilities

If a pensioner, the certificate number only need be given. If not, give the number of the former application if one was made.

That he has not been employed in the MILITARY OR NAVAL SERVICE otherwise than as stated above. That he makes this Declaration for the purpose of being placed on the Pension-Roll of the United States, under the provisions of the Acts of June 27, 1890, and May 9, 1900, and under Order No. 78, March 15, 1904, of the Commissioner of Pensions, allowing pension on account of old age. He hereby appoints—
