DECLARATION OF WIFE UNDER ACT OF MARCH 3, 1899.

STATE OF Maryland
COUNTY OF Baltimore ss:

On this 2nd day of January, A. D. 1912, personally appeared before me, a Justice of the Peace within and for the County and State aforesaid, Eliza Jackson, aged 68 years, a resident of Baltimore City County of _____, State of Maryland, who being duly sworn

according to law, makes the following declaration under the act of March 3, 1899, in order to obtain one-half of the pension due or to become due her husband, James Amos Jackson, who is a

resident pensioner of the United States, and who* Deserted Me Without Cause

after receiving his pension in September 1901.
He is not an Inmate of Soldier's Home or Institution of any kind.

That her husband served as a _____ in Co. H, Reg. 19, U.S. (Rank.) (Here give full service of husband.)

C. Vol. Inf, and is pensioned under certificate number _____

That she was married under the name of Eliza Gordon, to said James Amos Jackson, at Baltimore Md. on the 15th day of January, 1885, by Rev C. H. Mahoney.

That she has not been divorced from her said husband; that she is a woman of good moral character and in necessitous circumstances, and is not an inmate of any institution or home provided for the wives and children of soldiers and sailors.

That her post-office address is 918 Druid Hill Avenue County of Baltimore, State of Maryland
