2 Ellicott City Md, and am the wife of Samuel Scott, laborer, and
3 John Hall was my uncle and died in this town when my girl Car-
4 oline was a little baby and she is now eleven years old and I
5 attended his burial. He was married but once within my recol-
6 lection and that was to Mary Williams who is also dead, he lived
7 or rather he use to wait on Eliza Gordon and got her with two
8 children but they never were never married to my knowledge. I
9 knew Eliza from my birth but never knew her to be married at
10 Ellicott City, have seen her three times since she moved to Bal-
11 timore as she would come out to see my uncle John Hall and I
12 took her to the stone quarry where he worked. Whether he was
13 supporting her or giving her money I do not know. I never knew
14 James Amos Jackson. I knew of Eliza Gordon being divorced from
15 no husband at this place. I never saw her living with John Hall
