16 Ans. I certainly do. Jackson is the only man I ever stood on the
17 floor with. I went by the name of Eliza Gordon my whole life.

18 Qr. What relation was William H. Brown, (B.J. 5,) to you?

19 Ans. My son. His father was John Hall. I gave him the name of
20 Brown from his fathers sister, Martha Brown, because he was not
21 legitimate. All my children by Hall were known by the name of
22 Brown, its funny is'nt it but its the truth. I had no husband
23 named Brown and lived with no person of that name as his mistress
24 or housekeeper. George Brown and Eleanora Brown of Ellicott City
25 will know about John Halls children and the name they took.

26 The son William H. Brown is dead. I desire to make no further
