Madam:

Referring to your claim, under the Act of March 3, 1899, for one-half the pension allowed James A. Jackson, Co. H, 19 U. S. C. Vol. Inf., Ctf. No. 590, 184, you are advised that you should file your own sworn statement showing all the facts and circumstances leading up to and immediately attending the separation between you and the pensioner, giving the exact date thereof and the causes which induced it.

In the matter of necessitous circumstances, you should further state under oath whether you have any property, real or personal, and if so, the value thereof; whether you have any income, money in bank, stocks, bonds or other investments; or whether you are entirely dependent upon your daily labor for support, and if so, the kind of labor and the compensation received therefor by the day, week or month should be explicitly shown.
