Sir:

Pension was recently granted under certificate #794,555 Act of April 19, 1908 to Eliza Jackson, widow of James A. Jackson, late private, Co. "H" 19th U. S. C. Inf. at the rate of \$12 per month, to commence July 15, 1914.

The Special Examiner states in his report that this pensioner exhibited evidence of a weak or failing mind during the taking of her testimony and that she requires the attendance of another person to assist her in preparing her food and in dressing.

In that state of the case it would appear necessary to have her placed under committee ship in order that the pension may be used for her support and maintenance.

As you are the attorney of record I am calling your attention to the facts in the case with the view of having a suitable person appointed committee. The Committee should give a bond of at least \$500.
