In response to your letter of the 29th ultimo,

relative to pension claim No. 1,031,133, Eliza Jackson,
as widow of James A. Jackson, Co. H, 19 U. S. C. Inf.,

you are advised that the case has been found to require
special examination to determine its merits, and the

papers are now in the hands of a special examiner whose
district includes Baltimore, Maryland.

When the examiner reaches the case in its turn on

his docket he will call on the claimant for her testimony
and will also explain to her the purpose and scope of

the examination. It will not be necessary for her to

file further testimony, as the Bureau has undertaken to

secure through its special examiners the requisite evidence

on which to base a just adjudication of the claim.
