Sir:

The above-entitled claim for pension requires a certified copy of the public record, under seal, showing the date of the soldier's death. If claimant is unable to furnish record evidence, she should state that fact under oath, giving reasons, and furnish the affidavit of the attending physician or the testimony of two witnesses who were present, showing the date of said death. There should also be furnished a certified copy of public or church record, under seal or oath, showing the record evidence is not obtainable, the claimant should state that fact, under oath, giving reasons, and furnish the affidavit of the person who performed the ceremony or the testimony of two witnesses who were present, showing the date of said marriage.

In addition the claim requires the testimony of credible witnesses who knew soldier and claimant from the time each became of marriageable age, showing whether either
