Sir

In reply to
your communication of the 17th inst in
relation to the claim of Edward Parker.
I would say that I have not got any of
the retain copies of Muster + Pay Rolls.
When I was mustered out of the service
I was ordered to turn them over with
the Muster Out Roll + I can only give
from memory.

If I am not mistaken + I think
that I am not, I had 1 sergt killed +
two privates wounded, both slightly.

I do not seem to recall Edward
Parker as one of the wounded, it seemed
to me that his name was Parks but could
not say certain, his wound was in the
right arm near the elbow. I did not
have a man wounded ^{in the} neck + jaw or a
bout the head. This man was wounded just
as he raised his gun to fire the ball struck
at the gun stalk first.

The other man wounded was Crawford
