Madam:

I have to advise you that it appears from evidence obtained by means of a Special Examiner, including your own sworn statement now on file that you have ~~been~~ violated the Act of Congress of August 7-1882, having lived in open and notorious adulterous cohabitation with one Charles E. Lawrence, by whom you have given birth to an illegitimate child, since the death of your late husband the above named soldier and since the passage of the said law; the penalty for which is the termination of your pension under the above numbered certificate

Under the provisions of the act of Congress of December 21, 1893, you will be allowed a period of thirty days from <sup>receipt hereof</sup> this date in which to file testimony in rebuttal of the evidence referred to, and if the same is not satisfactory, and no sufficient reason appears why an extension of time should be made, your name will be dropped from the pension roll at the time indicated above.

Such evidence must be submitted in the form of affidavits, and the envelope inclosing the same should be addressed to the Commissioner of Pensions, and marked in the lower left-hand corner, "Board of Review." This letter should be returned therewith.
