I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 106,032, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Larry Robinson was enrolled on the 14th day of March, 1864, at Baltimore Md in Co. "I", 30th Regiment of U. S. C. Troops Volunteers, to serve Three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Corporal on the 18th day of March 1864, at Baltimore Md, in Co. "I", 30th Regiment of U. S. C. Troops Volunteers, to serve Three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "I" of that Regiment, for the months of July and August, 1864, he is reported "Missing since the Battle before Petersburg Va July 30th 1864". His name does not appear on any of the subsequent Rolls on file in this Office.
