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Keelboat, owned by Mr Allen Williams who is dead. I was born on said place. My father belonged to the Williams' but my mother was a free dealer, that is her Master permitted her to hire out, and have some white persons stand responsible for her. He was born October 25-1844.

2 What was the condition of your son's health when he came out of service?

A His health was poor. He was very thin, and was six feet some inches in height, and was not at all strong. He had lung disease when he got home and had an awful cough, and would spit up blood, had bronchitis of the throat, never had any local hemorrhages. My son always lived in Baltimore and died there, October 13th 1885. He lived at No 1 Pear Alley in the West End of Baltimore, where he died. After his wife died, he lived with my sister, Sarah Jane Harris, off and on. She is also dead.

My family doctor, Dr. Winslow attended my son until ^{Dr. Winslow} he died, then during his last illness he was attended by a young man a young physician, who was from Virginia, he was taken with consumption and came home and died. I cannot give his name.
