

support whatever (after you left Baltimore)?

A No, sir, He was sick a great deal, and he only got his pension money every three months, and it only amounted to about four dollars a month, and I had to let him have money, and had to pay for his burial.

Q These George W Harris never lived with, or supported you in whole or in part after you left Baltimore Md. in 1866?

A He never lived with me, and never supported me, but would send me a dollar or so every time he could spare it out of his pension. My husband, Mr Bauneau was living until June 11th 1878, and he furnished me with a support as best he could off his pay as a Minister of the Gospel while he lived, but he got small pay.

I cannot give you the exact date of my marriage to Jamett Bauneau, but I was married during slavery time, by Rev Temperance Brown, of the Episcopal Church, He is dead.
