When I would meet him after the war he appeared to suffer from his wound - I cannot tell what the symptoms were - he was not able to labor.

I never knew his mother - do not know who she was. No, I never knew his wife - cannot tell whether he was married or not. I recall that he had a boy, or they said that was his son, but I cannot tell who the boy's mother was. I do not remember the boy's name or what became of him.

Q Was the soldier ever troubled with a cough or disease of lungs to your knowledge?

A He seemed to be coughing very much the last time I saw him, and he was nothing but skin and bones.

Q When did you first notice this cough?

A I cannot answer that. Every time I would see him after the war he would be coughing and holding his hand to his breast. He was tall, thin and stooping - was thin through the chest - was that way when I first knew him in the Company. I have been correctly reported.
