

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT.

Whereas I have made application for Pension under act of June 27, 1890 and whereas I am desirous to have a distinct understanding as to the fee to be paid my attorney, now therefore this agreement witnesseth that for and in consideration of services rendered and to be rendered in the premises by my Attorney John E. Latimer of Washington D. C. I have agreed and do hereby agree to allow my said Attorney the sum of *Ten Dollars and no more* which shall include all amount to be paid him for any service rendered or to be rendered in furtherance of said claim.

Provided however that no part of said fee shall be paid unless my Pension shall be allowed and then only in the manner now authorized by law.
