DECLARATION FOR INVALID PENSION

Claim under Act of February 1907 which originated in the U. S. Senate and was known as Senate 976.

That he has not been employed in the military or naval service otherwise than as stated above (Here state what the service was, whether prior or subsequent to that stated above, and the dates at which it began and ended.)

This application is intended to cover allegation of at least sixty days service in WAR WITH MEXICO in cases dates above given show such services.

Claims benefit of Act of February 1907 which originated in U. S. Senate and was known as Senate 976 59th Congress 2nd Session, having served the full period required by the statute in one of the Wars mentioned and having reached the age specified in the said Act, and having been honorably discharged from the service of the United States.

That he has applied for pension under application No. That he is a pensioner under Certificate No. 1008390 at the rate of \$ 6 month. Claims the rate of pension specified in said Act for the age herein before stated.

That he makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension-roll of the United States under the provisions of the act herein mentioned.
