"My name is *Richard Dayrick* I am *68* years old, and I reside in *Baltimore, Md.* at No. *417 State* Street.

I have known claimant *John H. Murphy* from his boyhood. We were intimate from time he was a child and I can testify that he has always been of good moral character of sober and peaceable disposition and that the injury to his left leg, a marked deformity causing considerable lameness in walking was not in any way due to vicious habits. I make this statement from my intimacy with him before he incurred same at time thereof & ever since. I do not know the exact circumstances of the injury but it was incurred about 1860 by being thrown from a horse & I did not see him thrown but I saw him soon after and investigated the facts from him his mother & others as I lived next door & I know he was sober the date of the incurrence. We were both in service I in Co D 39 U.S.A. & he was in Co G 30 U.S.A. and were brigaded together & in hospital at same time.

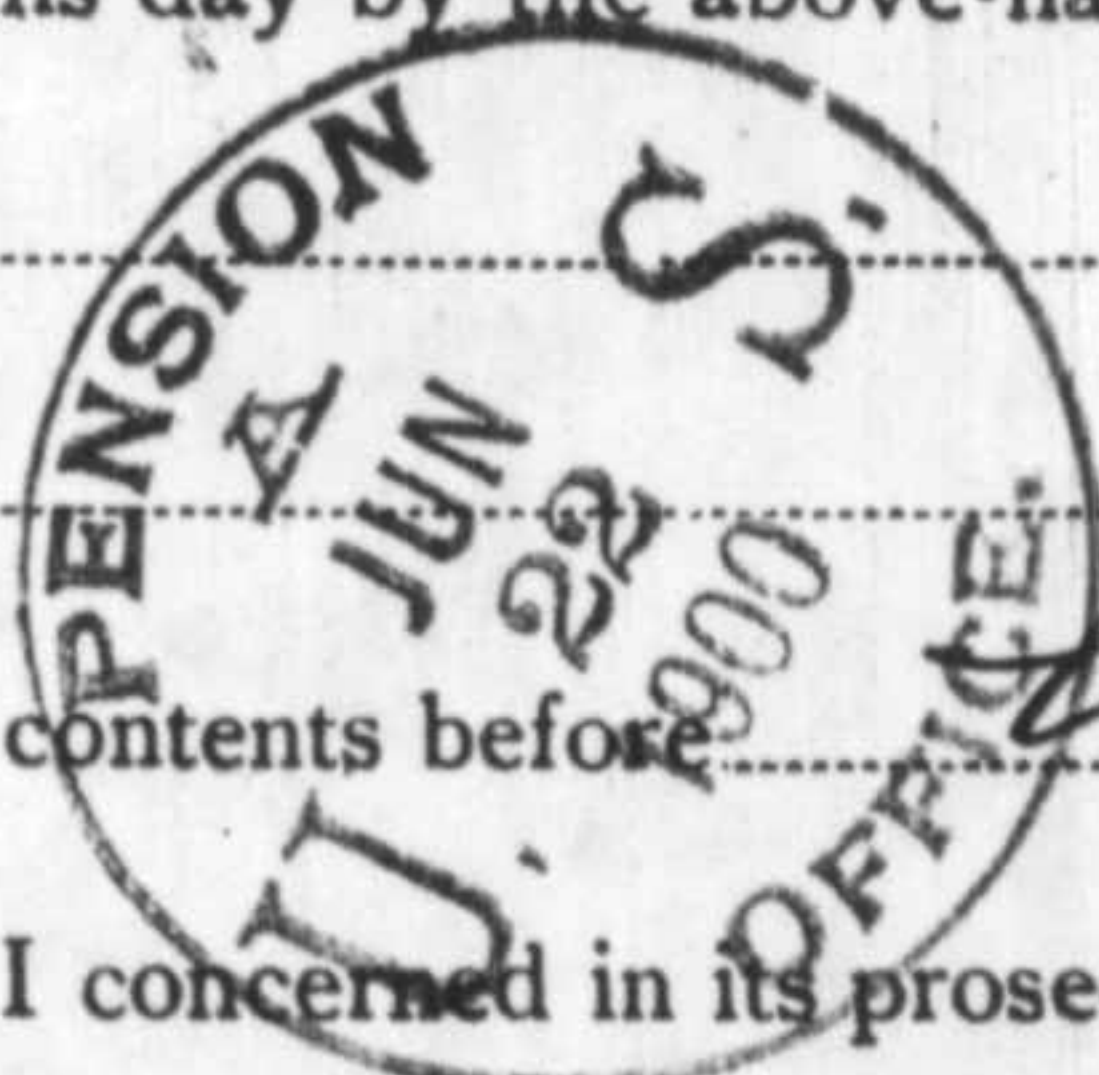
