"My age is 53 years, I reside in ^{Cumberland} ~~Baltimore~~, Md., at No. 146 Frederick St. Street.

My name is Frederick Bungee late Sergt Co. G. 30 U.S.C. I am well acquainted with John H. Murphy late Sergt of Co. G. 30 U.S. A., having served in the same Regiment with him, I know of his being taken sick at a place called Fish Pond in Virginia about June or July 1864 and that he was taken from there to the hospital and did not return to the Regiment until the following year about January or something thereabout I have known him ever since and from statements made me at different times I believe him to be suffering from contracted diseases of the throat and Rheumatism from which I still believe him to be still a sufferer.
