Dear Sir:

In reply to your circular under date of July 16th I would by the State that I have held my residence in Baltimore ever since my discharge from the army, Dec. 1865 I lived at No 4 Fanny Alley 12 years I then removed to 1141 W. Maryland St (then 562) and there I remained until about seven years ago when I removed to my present residence 1336 N Carey St.

My occupation during that time: Whitewasher, Kalsominer, waiter, porter, storekeeper, janitor, and at present printer. I cannot positively state the times I have been compelled to stop work on account of my disabilities as I took no particular account of them. My treatment for the diseases, when ^{not} attended by a physician.
