two months, above a whisper. I rejoined my
regiment at Raleigh N.C. about April or the latter
part of March 1865. Previous to that time I did
special duty, from Jan. 1865, at Buja's head
quarter - being Buja's Quartermaster Sergeant and
Wagon Boss. I remained with my regiment
until the mustering out of the same.

I cannot hear but little out of my left ear.
My throat trouble has increased to such an
extent that I am continually bothered with it
and my rheumatism affects me most when
the weather is bad. Sometimes for several
days before bad weather makes its appearance.
