I am claimant's son-in-law;
 I became acquainted with claimant
 and her husband, Benj. Davis, ^{during} ~~some~~
 my boyhood, before the war; they then
 lived together as man and wife, recognized
 one another as such and were so re-
 garded in the community; I married
 their daughter in 1876; soldier died five
 or six years ago; since then claimant
 has not re-married; she has no real
 property except the house she lives
 in, worth \$400 or \$500; she has no
 income except the proceeds of her
 own labor; I lived near them when
 he enlisted; I know he was in the
 army about two years, but don't know
 what company and regt he was in;
 I often saw him with a U.S. uniform
 on while his regt was stationed at
 Camp Beleger, this city.
