

GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.

In the matter of the claim of Jesse Fry Co I 4th Regt USCA  
I, Thos W. Trusty, a resident of Baltimore  
in the County of 224 Beade, State of Maryland Age 47  
on oath depose and say, I was a member of Co I 4th

N.S.C. and about November 1863 I was  
working on the fortifications at Fort Mageruder  
in Company with Jesse Fry and others.

The scaffolding for the Relays of earth from  
the bottom of the pit, upon which Jesse Fry  
was working gave way from the weight of  
the earth and the men shovelling and pre-  
cipitated the working party to the ground  
severely injuring Jesse Fry - who was sent  
to care of the Surgeon of the Fort. He remained  
on the Sick list. Carrying his left arm in a  
sling until the Company rejoined the Regiment  
at Point Lookout in the Spring - when I missed  
him and understand he was sent to Hospital  
at Fortress Monroe. He was never able for duty  
after receiving the injury above related =
