DEPOSITION *N*Case of *Jesse Fry*Ch. No. *364.780*

On this *29th* day of *February*, 188*5*, at *Baltimore*, County of *Chesapeake*, State of *Maryland*, before me, *J. M. Sparks*, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared *William Payne*, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: *My age is 45 years*

 I am not related to *Clarence* and never knew him prior to my enlistment in *August 1863* Company *I 4th U.S.C.* *Dremond* with the company until we landed in front of *Petersburg Va* in *June 1864*, was away then for about two months, and was wounded again at *Dutch Gap*. and was *Discharged* in *May 1866*.
 I remember that *Jesse Fry* carried *one* of his arms in a *slings* before I was wounded the first time. I don't recollect that he carried his arm in a sling after I was wounded. I don't know what was the matter with his arm, but I think he told me that the doctor said it was *phlegmatism*.
 I never saw him get hurt at any time or place. I never tented with him. I never saw him sick in tent. and never knew of him being in any hospital.
 I never knew of him having anything
