said pension claim, deposes and says:any one but himself say that
he had.I know nothing personally of
his conduct since discharge.Can't say that I ever knew of
him hurting his wrist in
the Army.I have heard you read my former
affidavit. And now I remember
that I did see him with his left
arm in a sling while we were
at Fort Magruder about January
1864, but can't say whether
he fell from a platform or
how he hurt his wrist. He
carried his wrist in a sling
for a week or such a matter,
and was excused from duty.
I saw some men working on
Fort Magruder, but cannot
swear that Fry was one of them.My answers are correctly in
