Personally came before me, a Justice of Peace in and for aforesaid County
 and State, Wm M. Fletcher, aged 41 years
 and at 100 McElaney St. Baltimore City, aged years
 citizen of the Town of Baltimore, County of Baltimore, State of
Maryland not, well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who,
 being duly sworn, declare in relation to aforesaid case, as follows:

He was a private of Co I Hth U. S. C. I.
and knew Jesse Fry when he joined the
Co. in August 1863. At this time Fry was an
able bodied man and took his turn with
the men in any kind of duty.

After Christmas of 1863 and sometime about
January 1864. When working on the Forti-
fications at Williamsburg Fry was injured by
the falling of a platform in the left wrist.
I did not see him fall. but I saw him at
work on the platform that day and the next
day I saw him with his arm in a sling
and he was not able to duty further on
account of injury to his left wrist.

I further declare that I have no interest in said case, and am not concerned in
 its prosecution.
