

Additional Evidence -

It alleges inability to obtain responses from some of the officers + surgeons + forwards letter from Capt Blakely -

Capt Blakely writes that he can give no evidence in the claim as nearly all the details of the affair have gone from his mind. The records of the Co. should contain a record of the fact -

Henry Jones, filed Sept 9, 1880, testifies that he was a member of Co "C" 19, U.S.C.V. + was present + saw Clt wounded in right wrist at Petersburg Va - July 30, 1864. Rolls for July + Aug 1864 show Jones Present for Duty

Since discharge

Andrew Bolden, filed Dec 11, 1880, testifies that he saw Clt when discharged + remembers that Clt was then afflicted by an injury to his right wrist, causing his hand to be drawn + making him unable to straighten the fingers

John Mitchell filed Dec 11, 1880, testifies that Clt came to his house immediately after his discharge. His right hand was then badly injured + the fingers badly drawn.

Matthew Goldboro, + James Burke filed Feb 6, 1881  
testify that the injury to Clt's right wrist existed
