SIR:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your request of June 3rd, 1879, for certain information for use in the consideration of application for Pension, No. 268,983, and to return it herewith, with the following information from the records of this office:

It appears from the Rolls of U. S. Colored Troops on file in this office that William Wells was enrolled on the 8th day of Dec., 1863, at Queen Ann St. in Co. "C" 19th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private, on the 25th day of Dec., 1863, at Camp Stanton, near Bryantown, Md. in Co. "C", 19th Regiment of U. S. Colored Troops, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Rolls of Co. "C" of that Regiment for the months of from Organization to Dec. 31st, 1865, he is reported present for duty, Jan'y and Feb'y '66, absent "Det. as Guard escorting prisoners to Albany, N.Y. ++" from Feb'y 28th to Dec. 31st present for duty. He was mustered out of service with Co. Jan'y 15th, 1867 at Brunswick, Meas. Co. was in action near Petersburg, Va. July 30th '64. No evidence that he was wounded is alleged on Co. or Regtl records on file in this office.
