

DEPOSITION

Case of Martha Woodford, No. 672,765

On this 26 day of May, 1899, at
Cambridge, county of Dorchester
State of Md., before me, R. P. McElroy, a
special examiner of the Bureau of Pensions, personally appeared

Katie Harvard, who, being by me first duly sworn to
answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this special
examination of aforesaid claim for pension, deposes and says:

I am 35 years of age; my post-office address is Cambridge
Maryland.

I know the claimant have known her ever since I can
remember - I just remember the fact of her marriage.

Have lived near neighbor to her all of my life and
we have visited back and forth.

For the past 16 years we have lived about $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile
apart.

I was not present when either of the children was
born - but visited her within a day or so after the
children Samuel Garfield and Walter were born
and I helped wait on her and cook for her during
her sickness following the birth of these children, and I
can remember the dates of birth of these children
from the date of birth of children of my own born
nearly at the same time as her children.

Samuel Garfield was born March 18-1883.

Walter was born Sept 21-1885.

The reason I am so sure of the dates of birth
is I had a daughter born May 19-1883 - the claim-
ant and I have often talked of the fact that
"Garfield" was 2 months and 1 day older than my
child.

and I had another daughter born Oct 20-1885 -
and Walter lacked 1 day of being a month old
when this child of mine was born - and we
have also commented on this coincidence.

and I can also give the ages of one of her other
older children by the date of birth of my oldest
