

up and the sum was between \$400 and \$500.
and since then my mother has borrowed \$500
my father's debts have been paid, and one
of the places will have to be sold to meet
the debts.

We have not divided the income from
the land have simply used it for the
living expenses.

The children Samuel Garfield, Walter, Lilly
and Sarah are still living, & live with my mother
I can not give their ages because I have
paid no attention to it. can hardly give
any now age.

My mother has had no income or means
of support since my father's death than
what has been raised on the place.

The woods land brought in no income - simply
furnished us with fire wood.

My oldest brother died on the place at "The Rock"
as nearly as I can remember he raised 78 acres of wheat
and about 11 or 12 bbls of corn - 2 Tins wheat was worth
about 70¢ a bushel & corn \$1.20 per bbl.

Of this \$15 had to go to Missy Harris for her down interest - and
after paying interest and taxes and postman bills my mother
had nothing left - not over \$500 any way.

On this place we raised about 14 bbls of corn - the land was
mostly in pasture for the cows and horses.

We sold us corn from other place used it to keep our stock
and now have only about a bbl left to keep 2 horses and one
cow until next crop season.
