Q What property did the soldier leave at the time of his death, and do you now own?

A He left the following real estate.

1<sup>st</sup> He left this place. 14<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> = He paid \$300 for the property with and old house on it - and the summer before he died this new house was put on it costing about \$350<sup>00</sup>.

2<sup>nd</sup> Also 29 acres near "The Rock" - 1 mile from here with a small house - for which he paid I think \$400<sup>00</sup>, and put a small addition to the house on it.

3<sup>rd</sup> He also owned 76 acres of scrub wood land I do not know what it is worth - but we can not sell it - he sold a part of the same tract for about \$4 an acre. This is all the real estate he owned at his death.

Q In the assessment record two pieces of real estate 35 and 98 acres?

A I may be mistaken as to exact acreage but I think I am right.

Q Any mortgage against any of this property?  
A Against the 29 acres there was and is \$100<sup>00</sup> against it with 3 years interest due today. No mortgage against the other property. I can not give an itemized account
