

DEPOSITION BCase of Mary E. Coon, No. 242940

On this 7 day of June, 1887, at Hagerstown, County of Washington, State of Maryland, before me, Thomas Huse, a Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared George Leckig, M.D., who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: I am 47 years old I am a physician and surgeon, my residence is Hagerstown, Md., which is my post office address.

I have practiced medicine 26 years. I was studying medicine under Dr. S. J. Sungen, who is now in Toledo Ohio, sometime in the Summer of 1860, a post mortem examination was made on the body of Daniel Coon a colored man, and it was found that he died of cancer of the stomach. I was present and assisted in the examination.

I was not a practicing physician at the time merely a student so I have no memoranda or data of the matter.

I had no acquaintance with the family but I recollect that he had a wife and some children and that is about all.

I have no interest in the claim.
