 first wife under sixteen years of age at the
 time of his death. I never had any child
 or children by Soldier. Soldier and I lived
 together from our marriage to Soldier's
 death and were never divorced. I can
 prove this by Frank and Alice Brooks of Hager-
 stown Md. and by my father Alexander Banks
 of this city. I have not remained since
 Soldier's death nor lived with any man
 as his wife. I have heard Soldier say
 that he incurred his hernia of right-side
 while in the army, I do not recollect as to
 when or where it occurred. He said that
 he slipped and felt some thing give way
 and that he remarked to Perry and Robert-
 Moxley that he was captured. I do not
 recollect of hearing him say whether he was
 treated for his capture while in the service.
