DEPOSITION ACase of Louisa A. Henry, No. 615,878

On this 28 day of Jan, 1896, at Baltimore City, County of _____
 State of Md, before me, J. H. McIntosh, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Louisa A. Henry, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer truly all interrogatories propounded to her during this Special Examination of aforesaid pension claim, deposes and says: My name is Louisa A. Henry, age 29 years, occupation domestic and my first office address is # 824 Hillen St. Baltimore Md. I am the above named applicant for pension as the widow of Thomas Henry late of Band 1 Brig M.S.C.T. I was married to Thomas Henry Sept-10 1891 at his house in Hagerstown Md. on W. Bethel St. by the Rev. O. D. Robinson pastor of the Ebenezer A.M.E. Church. Md. Henry procured ^{the license} I probably did not give him my full name Louisa A. Banks when he went for the license. He knew me simply as Louisa. I think I gave him my correct age. I can not account as to how my age appears as 38 years in the application for marriage license. The reason that I did not mention that soldier had had two wives prior to his marriage to me in my former statement was that I did know that he was ever married, the the woman Mary Eliza. I have heard soldier speak of having lived with Mary Eliza and I have seen her grave. This Mary Eliza and Lucinda are all the wives or women that soldier ever had prior to his marriage to me. Soldier
