well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declares each for himself, in relation to aforesaid case, as follows: We have known Mary E

Moxley, the widow of Joseph Moxley
for 50 to 35 years and from
intimate acquaintance with her
and her affairs and constant inter-
course and frequent conversations
with her and other circumstances,
we know that since June 27, 1890,
she has been without other means
of support than her own daily labor
and so remains, and that we would
know it if she had other means of
support.

We also testify from personal
knowledge gained as above set forth
that the said widow has not re-
married since the death of the
soldier Joseph Moxley, on the first
day of September, 1884

We further declare that we have no interest in said case and are
 not concerned in its prosecution.
