GENERAL AFFIDAVIT.State of Maryland, County of Washington, ss.

ON THIS 1st day of December, A. D. 1891, personally appeared before me, aCircuit Court in and for the aforesaid County, duly authorized to administer oaths,Thomas Henry aged 56 years, a resident of Stagerstownin the County of Washington and State of Marylandwhose postoffice address is Stagerstown Maryland andPerry Moxley aged 61 years, a resident of Stagerstownin the County of Washington and State of Marylandwhose postoffice address is Stagerstown Marylandwell known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declares each for himself, in relation to aforesaid case, as follows: We have known Mary

E. Moxley the widow of Joseph Moxley
for 50 to 40 years and from intimate
acquaintance with her and her affairs and
constant intercourse and frequent conversations
with her, and other circumstances, we know
that since June 27, 1890, she has been without
other means of support than her own daily labor
and so remains and that we would know if
if she had other means of support. We also testify
from personal knowledge gained as above set forth
that the said widow has not re-married since the
death of the soldier, Joseph Moxley on the first day
of September 1884, and we each remember the fact
that he died upon the first day of September, 1884
for the following reasons: The affiant Thomas Henry
recalls the date from the fact that he received a very
severe fall upon the same day that said soldier died
and the affiant Perry Moxley recalls the date from
the fact that said soldier was his brother.
We further testify from personal knowledge gained
as above that both her children (the said
widow's children) Robert Moxley and
William A Moxley are still living.

We further declare that we have no interest in said case and are
 not concerned in its prosecution.
