DEPOSITION

Case of Mary E. Moxley, No. 368.984

On this eighteenth day of September, 1889, at
Hagerstown, County of Washington
 State of MD, before me, Wm. L. Lippert, a
 Special Examiner of the Pension Office, personally appeared Isaiah
Thompson, who, being by me first duly sworn to answer
 truly all interrogatories propounded to him during this Special Examination of aforesaid
 pension claim, deposes and says: My age is 45 years, occupation
a lumberman and P.O. address Box 46 East Church
St. Hagerstown MD

I first became acquainted with the late
Joseph Moxley in 1870, but had no intimate
 knowledge of him until about 10 years before he
 died.

During the last 8 years of his life time I lived
 in the same street and block with him, and saw
 him pretty much every day, and he was always
 complaining of one of his sides - the left one -
 and generally kept his hand pressed on it
 especially when walking up a hill.

His mouth was red and raw looking for
 all the time that I had knowledge of him.

I never heard the deceased or his wife
 what caused the pain in his left side or
 sore mouth but I did hear him say that
 he had always had good health before he
 was in the army.

I was present when the soldier died and
 for about an hour prior to the time of his death.

He had been at work on that day but was
 at his home and lying down on the lounge when
 I first called in to see him.

I assisted his wife, Clarimath, to lift him
 from off the lounge and to lay him on the floor
 and to take his foot off before he died.
