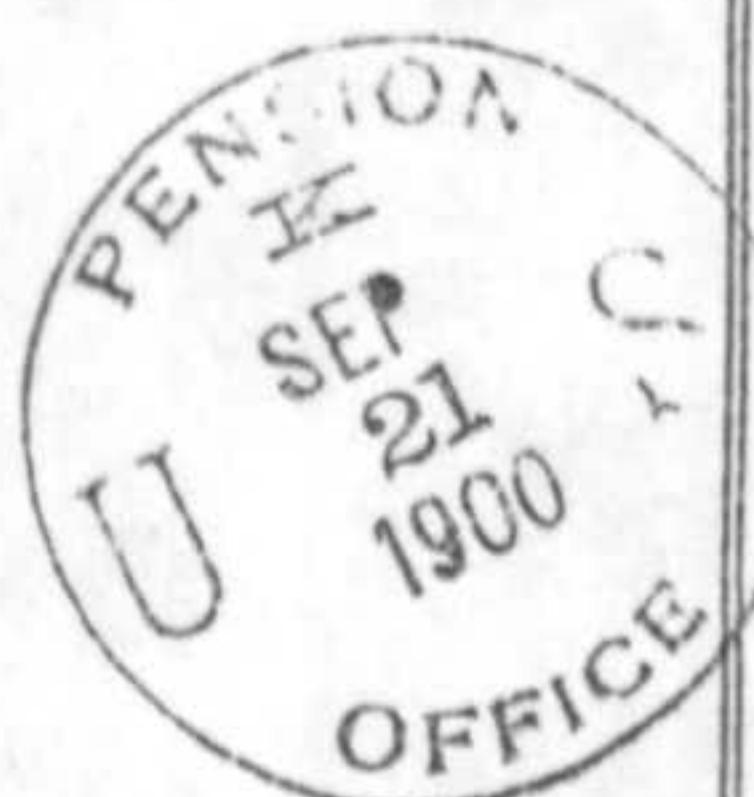


General Affidavit.
